Overview—That's Incredible!

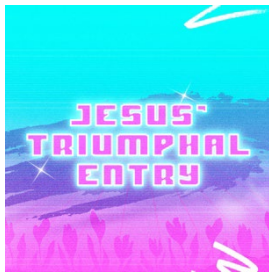
The Easter story and the amazing events surrounding Jesus' last weeks on earth are absolutely incredible! These extraordinary events actually happened and believing that has the power to change our life. In That's Incredible!, kids will explore:

- *What does incredible praise look like?*
- *How does Jesus' death and resurrection offer us an incredible life?*
- *How can we have incredible power to live for Jesus Christ?*

Kids will discover the answer to these questions and learn about the incredible story that God has planned for them.

SESSION OVERVIEW



*In this session, kids will discover that **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!** One of the last times Jesus entered Jerusalem during His life on earth is what we celebrate on Palm Sunday. We call it the “Triumphal Entry.” The people watching His entrance didn’t fully understand who He was. But they knew He was special. Their praise honored God for sending Jesus. But if they had fully understood who Jesus was, they would have worshipped Him. When we think of who Jesus is and all He has done, we should be moved to live in worship to the King of kings and offer Him incredible praise!*

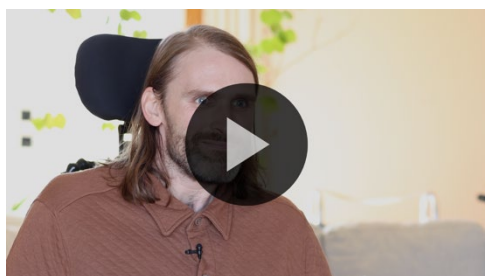

INTRODUCTION

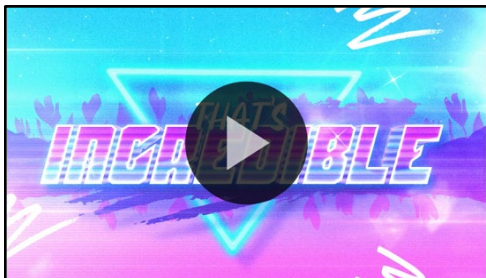
- *Optional: Play the **Countdown 5-Minute Video**.*



Welcome

Hello, everyone! I hope you've had a great week! Are you ready to check out all the cool things we're going to do today? (*Group response*) Remember, everything we do here has a reason, and that reason is to help us get closer to Jesus! Check this out!

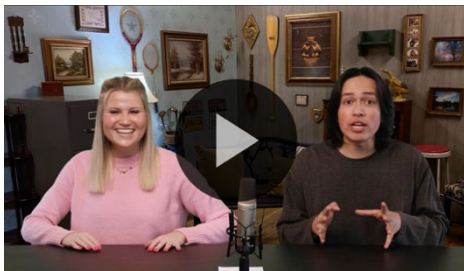
- *Play the **Theme Intro Video**.*



Today we're starting a very special series called, "That's Incredible!" People can do some incredible things. Have you ever seen anyone do a cool trick shot like making a basket by throwing a basketball backwards over their head with their eyes closed while standing at half court? (*Group response*) That's incredible right? Almost unbelievable!

Let's start our time together with a fun Challenge Accepted video to introduce what we'll talk about today.

- *Play the **Challenge Accepted A Video**.*



Dash and Joley have difficult challenge to do! Would you accept that challenge? (*Group response*) We’ll find out later if either of them mastered the sculpture. At least Jolie gave us some clues about what we’ll be talking about today.

Faith Fact

- Show the **Faith Fact Slide** or **Motion Graphic**.



Our Faith Fact today is: **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!** After we say our Faith Fact today, I want us to praise Jesus by shouting, “Hosanna!” That’s a cheer we might have heard in Bible times. Are you ready to try it? (*Group response*) **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise! (Hosanna!)** Let’s say it one more time! **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise! (Hosanna!)** I think we’re ready to cheer our way into today’s session.

Did you know that it’s almost time for Easter? At Easter, there are some pretty incredible things that we celebrate that took place in the Bible. (*Group response*) Today, we’re going to talk about one of the things that happened in the week leading up to Jesus’ death and resurrection. I can’t wait to find out more about it with you.

GAME | Throw Your Coat Relay

You Will Need	Getting Ready
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oversized jackets, enough for each team playing at the same time to have one • Painter’s tape 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Place the tape on the floor to mark the starting line.

- Show the **Game Time Slide** or **Motion Graphic**.



Let’s play a game. We’ll need to divide into teams to compete. When I say, “Go,” the first person on each team will put a coat on and then run to me. Then they’ll take the coat off, lay it down on the floor near my feet, and run back to the rest of their team. The next person on each

team will run down, pick up the coat, put it on, and run back to the starting line. Then the next person in line will put the coat on again, and run to me, and lay it down on the floor at my feet. The first team to have all the players put on the coat wins. Let's play!

- *Divide the group into equal teams of an odd number of kids, so the coats end up by you.*
- *Repeat the game if you have a large group or more teams than coats.*

(Hold up one of the coats.) This game is another hint about our Bible story today. People took their coats off and laid them on the ground in front of Jesus. They made a special path for Him to come into the city. It was their way to praise God for sending Jesus. Jesus was the Messiah, the promised Savior, they were waiting for. That made them want to worship God, and we can too.

WORSHIP

Thinking of who Jesus is and all He has done should move us to worship Him as the King of kings too. Let's offer Him incredible praise as we sing and worship Him now.

- *Lead the kids in singing one or two praise songs. See options at the beginning of the session.*

Incredible Story Video (Testimony)

This *That's Incredible!* series celebrates God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Since it will be a few weeks before we celebrate how the Holy Spirit came on Pentecost Sunday, I want us to focus on how incredible God is every week until then. Let's find out more about why **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!** Today, we'll meet Jared and hear the first part of his incredible story.

- *Play the **Jared's Incredible Story Video Part 1**.*



BIBLE LESSON | The Triumphal Entry (Luke 19:28–40)

You Will Need	Getting Ready

In our Bible story today, we're talking about some of the first things that happened in the Easter story. We're going to discover why **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!** Before we get started, let's pray together.

Prayer

Dear God, thank You for sending Jesus to come and save us from our sins. We know that only You are worthy of incredible praise! Amen.

Video Intro

To get us started with today's Bible lesson, let's watch this video.

- Play the **Bible Lesson Video**.



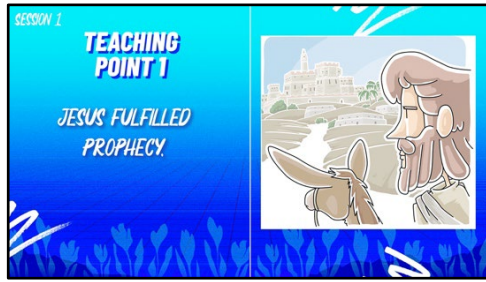
Jeremy tried so hard to explain to Hank what praising Jesus is all about. Do you think Hank understood? (*Group response*) Well, at least Hank figured out that the day wasn't all about him! Let's look at our Bible story for today.

Teaching Time

Have you ever thought about what it might have been like to be around Jesus when He walked on earth? (*Group response*) What do you think it would have been like? (*Allow responses.*) I think it would have been incredible! Today we're going to jump into a Bible story that is at the beginning of one of the most incredible weeks in history. But it all started long before Jesus was born.

1. Jesus fulfilled prophecy.

- Show the **Teaching Point 1 Slide**.



Prophets spoke about Jesus for hundreds of years before He came to earth. These prophets delivered God's messages to the people. Prophets told God's people that a Savior was coming. One of the messages from God about Jesus said that He would come riding on the colt of a donkey. That prophecy was given to the prophet Zechariah in Old Testament times, hundreds of years before Jesus came to earth. Let's read about it right now.

- Read Zechariah 9:9.

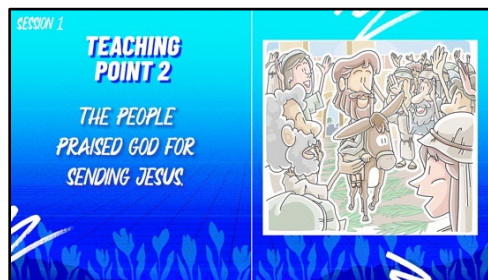
What did Zechariah say was going to happen in the future? (*Allow responses.*) He told the people that their king was coming on a donkey's colt! Jesus fulfilled this prophecy when He came into Jerusalem. Take your Bible and turn to Luke 19:28–35.

- Read Luke 19:28–35.

Do you think the disciples might have been worried about taking someone's donkey without asking first? (*Group response*) They might have been a little worried about it. But they'd seen Jesus do many amazing things that didn't make sense in the beginning. So I think they were ready to obey Him. That's a good thing because God had a plan in place all along for Jesus to come to the world to save people from their sins.

2. The people praised God for sending Jesus.

- Show the **Teaching Point 2 Slide**.



The people had seen Jesus do incredible things, and they praised God for it. But, if they had realized who Jesus is, the Son of God and the Savior of the world, they would have praised Jesus for who He is! Jesus wasn't like an earthly king. He had come to save them, not from the Roman Empire, but from their sins. That's why our Faith Fact says **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!**

- Read Luke 19:36–38.

There were many people in Jerusalem the day that Jesus rode in on the donkey. This event was so important that the first four books of the New Testament—the Gospels of Matthew, Mark,

Luke and John—all included this event. Each writer focused on different parts of the story. For example, John wrote that the people had palm branches when they went to see Jesus coming down the road ([John 12:12–19](#)). This is why we sometimes call this special day Palm Sunday. Luke added that some of the people laid their coats on the road to honor Jesus.

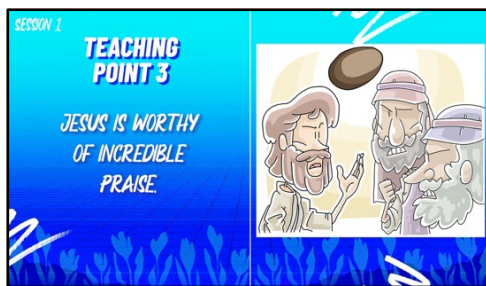
- *Choose a couple of kids to lay out the coats on the floor to make a path.*

Some of the people in the crowd had seen Jesus perform miracles and they had witnessed His power. They shouted and sang praises to God for all they had seen Jesus do. But even though they had seen Jesus do these incredible things and even though they had heard Him teach and preach, they were still missing part of the story!

The people were a little confused because they thought God would make Jesus their earthly king. They didn't know that the kingdom Jesus was starting was about getting people closer to God. Their praise would have been for Jesus if only they had known Jesus is God. I'm glad we know that **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!** True praise is more than just words. It depends on our attitude and our actions.

3. Jesus is worthy of incredible praise.

- *Show the **Teaching Point 3 Slide**.*



- *Read [Luke 19:39–40](#).*

Not everyone was happy that Jesus was getting attention and praise. Some people even wanted Jesus to make His followers be quiet. Do you know who that was? (*Group response*) The Pharisees, some of the religious leaders! Did Jesus agree with them? (*Group response*) No! Jesus said that if the people kept quiet and didn't praise God, then stones would burst out in cheers for Him.

- *Hold up the large rocks for the kids to see.*

Can you imagine what that would be like if the rocks started to talk and shout praises to Jesus? (*Group response*) It's a crazy thought. The Pharisees didn't fully understand why Jesus was worthy of praise. But the crowd of people praised God for Jesus' arrival anyway.

Rocks weren't created to have a relationship and friendship with Jesus—we were! Rocks weren't created to open their mouths and shout praises to Jesus—we were! We are the ones who were meant to live and make choices that honor Jesus because He is so good. When thinking of all Jesus has done for us, how can we keep quiet? Living for Jesus, placing Him first in our life, and making the kinds of decisions He would want us to make are a few ways we can give

Him the praise He deserves every minute of the day. That's exactly what our Faith Fact says. Let's shout it together. **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!**

PRAYER AND RESPONSE

You Will Need	Getting Ready
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Sticky notes, more than one per kid</i> • <i>Pencils, pens, or markers, one per kid</i> • <i>Blank wall or poster board</i> 	<p><i>No prep is needed for this activity.</i></p>

- *Consider playing a worship song softly in the background while kids pray.*

Because we know that **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!**, we can praise Him with our words, thoughts, and actions. Today, we're going to spend a few minutes thinking about the ways we can give Jesus the praise He deserves.

- *Give a few sticky notes and a pencil or pen to each kid.*

Maybe you need to close your eyes or turn your back to others in the room to help you focus. Think of some words or actions you could praise Jesus with. Allow the Holy Spirit to speak to you as you think about how to praise Jesus. As you think of these things, write each word or phrase on a different sticky note. When you're done, come and place the sticky notes on the wall. When we're finished, we'll see a giant collection of praise to Jesus!

- *Encourage the kids to find a spot in the room where they won't be distracted.*
- *Pause to allow time for the Holy Spirit to speak to kids and for the kids to put their sticky notes on the wall.*
- *Close in prayer. Consider having the kids repeat this prayer after you.*

Dear Jesus, You are so worthy of incredible praise! I want my life to honor You in all that I do. Help everything I say, everything I do, and every choice I make to shout praise to You. There is no one like You! Amen.

Salvation Prayer

The people in today's Bible story knew Jesus was awesome, but they didn't realize that He is God. They didn't know He had come to forgive them and save them from their sins. People sin when their choices go against God and His Word. But that's exactly why Jesus came! He lived a perfect, sinless life. Then He died on the Cross and came back to life. Jesus' death paid for people's sins to be forgiven so they could have an incredible relationship with God.

Jesus didn't come just for the people in Bible times. He came for all people of all time, and that includes you and me! Maybe you've been listening to me talk about how we were created to live as a praise to Jesus and to have a relationship—a friendship—with Him. But maybe you've never asked Jesus to come and be a part of your life, and you want to start that friendship now. Today you have an opportunity to do that! If you'd like to invite Jesus to be your Lord and Savior, let's pray together.

- Invite kids to pray with you or have everyone repeat the prayer after you.

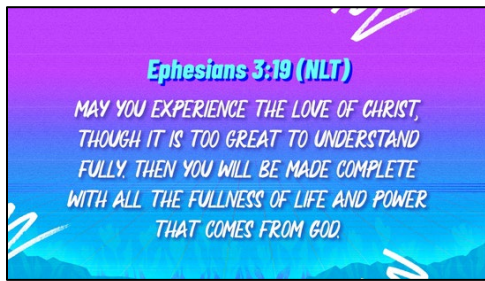
Dear Jesus, I believe You came to earth and died on the Cross so that I can be forgiven for the wrong things I've done. Please forgive my sins and make me a new person. I want to live for You. I believe You came back to life and will let me live with You forever. Thank You for coming into my life. Amen.

If you prayed that prayer for the first time, find me after we finish today. I want to talk with you about this wonderful new life you've started with Jesus in your life.

Faith Verse

Our Faith Verse talks about one of the reasons **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise**. It's because His awesome love for us is more than we will ever understand. Let's learn this Faith Verse together.

- Show the **Faith Verse Slide**.



Ephesians 3:19 (NLT)

May you experience the love of Christ, though it is too great to understand fully. Then you will be made complete with all the fullness of life and power that comes from God.

That's such an awesome Bible verse! Let's keep working on it as we focus on how incredible Jesus is and see if we can really memorize it!

Video Wrap-Up

Before we wrap up the Bible lesson, let's check in with the Challenge Accepted team to see how their challenge worked out.

- Play the **Challenge Accepted B Video**.



Let's remember to follow up on the team's challenge to make a list of the incredible things Jesus has done to deserve our praise. That might take a few minutes and several pieces of paper!

Faith Fact

Now, let's review our Faith Fact one more time. Remember, after we say our Faith Fact, we're going to shout and cheer for Jesus!

- Show the **Faith Fact Slide** or **Motion Graphic**.



Are you ready? **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!** (*Cheer and shout!*) Say it with me one more time. **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!** (*Cheer and shout!*) That was so much fun to praise Jesus together with you. I love getting to worship Jesus with you!

- *Dismiss kids to Small Group time or to go home if your group time ends here.*

SMALL GROUP (30 Minutes)

This section can be done in conjunction with the large group or on its own if you do small groups with your kids. During Small Group time, the goal is to connect kids with the Word of God and to each other. All activities are led by the small group leader.

GROUP CONNECTION | Don’t Let the Rocks Cry Out

You Will Need	Getting Ready
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>White or gray paper, one sheet per group</i> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Wad up the paper into a ball, one per group.</i>

In our Bible story, Jesus told the Pharisees that if people kept quiet, the stones along the road would burst out in cheers. Jesus is worthy of our praise, and praise should come from our mouths, not from the rocks. Let’s do that now.

Let’s play a game together. (*Hold up the paper ball.*) We’re going to stand in a circle and pass this “rock” like it’s a hot potato. We’ll say the Faith Fact together as we go. Whoever is holding the “rock” when we’re done will need to shout out a praise to Jesus before passing it on. You might want to praise Jesus for something He’s done or for something He’s given to you. It could be a miracle from the Bible or something you’re thankful for in your own life. Let’s see how many things we can praise Jesus for together.

- *Play the game as each kid gets the “rock” and shouts out the next word of the Faith Fact: **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!***
- *Play until every kid has had at a chance to hold the rock and shout out a praise.*

Say our Faith Fact with me one more time. **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!** (*Cheer and shout!*) Praising Jesus together with you is so much fun!

GAME | Bottle Flip Gauntlet

You Will Need	Getting Ready
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Four clean, empty bottles, one of each size per group – 4 oz., 8 oz., 16 oz., 2-liter</i> • <i>Water to add to empty bottle</i> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Empty the contents of the bottles and fill them ¼ full with water.</i> • <i>Test each bottle several times to ensure each works for this activity.</i>

Let’s play a fun game where we’re going to have to work together to flip various sizes of bottles and land them so that they’re standing up. First, we need to stand in a circle. We will start with the smallest bottle. We’ll take turns trying to flip the bottle until someone lands it. Once we land a bottle right side up, we can proceed to the next size bottle. Each time we land one, we’re going to shout out our Faith Fact and cheer!

- *Complete the bottle-flipping challenge together.*
- *Challenge round: See how quickly the group can flip all the bottles.*

This game reminds me of the many Old Testament prophecies about Jesus. Some things in the prophecies happened when Jesus was only a baby. Others happened in His ministry up to the time of His Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem. Our Bible story today about Jesus riding on a donkey into Jerusalem was just another big step leading up to the fulfillment of God's plan to rescue the world. Every prophecy that was fulfilled was just another reminder of how worthy of praise Jesus really is. That's why our Faith Fact is **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!**

BIBLE LESSON RECAP | The Triumphal Entry (Luke 19:28–40)

You Will Need	Getting Ready
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Bibles, one per kid 	No prep is needed for this activity.

The Bible tells us that Jesus is God's promised Messiah, the One who came to die on a cross, come back to life, and save people from their sins. We know Jesus is the Son of God. But when He lived on earth, many people didn't fully understand who He was. They thought He was an earthly king who would save them from the Roman Empire. But Jesus is so much more than that! He is the King of kings who came to rescue people from their sin.

As Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, what did the people do? (*Allow responses.*) They laid their coats out before Him to make a special path. They also used palm branches to praise God for sending Jesus. But if they had fully understood who Jesus was, they would have praised Jesus, too!

- Read the Bible story in [Luke 19:28–40](#).

We know who Jesus is. We know the incredible power He has and the things He can do. We know about all that He has done to show His incredible love for us. He is worthy of incredible praise. We can praise Jesus, not only with our words, but with the choices we make every day and how we live. When we put Him first and honor Him with the way we live, we are giving Him the incredible praise He is so worthy of.

Faith Fact

- Show the **Faith Fact Slide** or **Motion Graphic**.



Jesus is worthy of incredible praise! because of who He is and all He has done. Let's say our Faith Fact together and then give a big shout of praise to Him! Say it with me. **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!** (*Cheer*) One more time! **Jesus is worthy of incredible praise!** (*Cheer*)

GROUP DISCUSSION

*Feel free to use all or just a few questions for good discussion that reinforces the Faith Fact and Bible Lesson. Questions marked with * are designed for more conversation. Adjust the questions based on the age or maturity of your group.*

Let's take a few minutes to talk about what we learned about Jesus' Triumphal Entry and how we can apply it to our life.

Questions

What animal did Jesus ride as He was coming into Jerusalem and fulfilling an Old Testament prophecy?

What things did people lay out before Jesus as He approached Jerusalem on a donkey?

* How do you think it would have felt to be part of the crowd praising God that day?

What did Jesus say the rocks would do if the people didn't praise God?

* Why is Jesus worthy of your incredible praise?

* What are some words we could say to praise Jesus?

* What actions can we do to praise Jesus?

* How can living our life for Jesus be a way to praise Him?

* Who can you tell about the things Jesus is worthy of praise for?

Prayer

Finish group discussion by taking prayer requests and sharing praise reports. Keep track of your small group's prayer requests and review them each time you meet.

Let's pray together now. Who has a need you'd like the group to pray for?

- *Have kids share and pray for each other's prayer requests.*

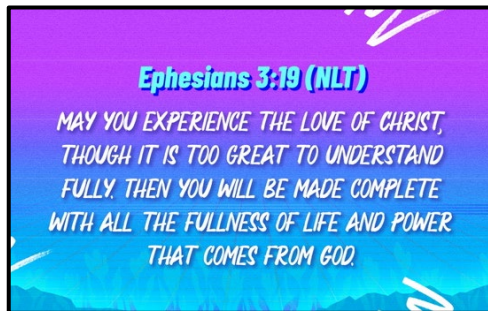

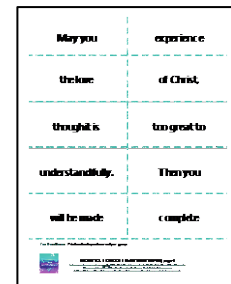

Faith Verse Fun | Beat the Clock

Let’s play a game with our Faith Verse and see if we can beat the clock. The words of the Faith Verse are on these slips, and we’re going to unscramble them. Let’s work together to put the verse in order and then shout it out. Let’s see how quickly we can do that together. Then, we’ll mix it up and do it a second time. Our goal is to see if we can beat our time from the first round.

- Play the game together.



It’s so important for us to memorize God’s Word and hide it in our heart. I love watching you get faster and faster with each round. You’re incredible!

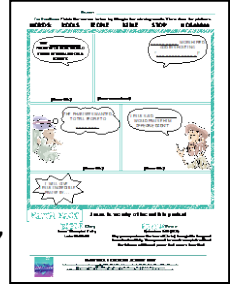
- Play this game again if time allows, continually trying to beat your time.
